

Headteacher's Newsletter



I already cannot wait for next year's one! Great job everyone!


























































Sparx Maths – Our First Year!

Back in September we stepped away from our beloved Hegarty Maths and joined Brittons and Bower Park in using Sparx Maths. Sparx produced individualised homework for students every week – over time focussing on their weaker areas as well as complimenting our Maths Curriculum.

Over the year, here are our school highlights:

2,142,696 questions answered correctly

24,146 hours spent on personalised learning

520 students have improved at their timestables

In particular these students have gone above and beyond, becoming the top student for their year group in earning XP – this XP not only comes from completing the compulsory homework tasks, but also completing the XP boosts and target work. These extra activities provide students with targeted questions to help deepen their understanding of what they are covering in maths.











































PLC Drama Workshops

The PLC's inclusive Drama workshops with the Habbit Factory has proved a huge success!




