We heard in Miss Ducker's assemblies last week about the amazing successes of the Year 11s who just got their results, and what it takes from you to be equally successful! Every lesson counts is our key message for this year, and within that, every minute counts! So:

- ✓ Follow the Door in Four and arrive so you catch all those important instructions from your teacher and complete all starter activities
- ✓ Being 'Ready to Learn' not only means being unpacked and settled quickly, but being fully involved in the lesson: joining in verbally, growing your vocabulary, having a go, not giving up, asking for help!
- ✓ Maintain your focus all the way through the lesson and take full part in any final tasks or 'exit ticket' activities





Please Keep Our Students Safe!



Despite the fact that the UK has some of the safest roads in the world, thousands of children are injured on our roads every year, making road traffic accidents a significant cause of premature child death.

Child pedestrian road risk increases as children become more independent (from aged 10 upwards), with most child casualties occurring between the school run hours, namely 8-9am and 3-4pm.

This is due to this age group being more likely to move around unaccompanied by adults, and also having cognitive and physical limitations that make them more vulnerable in road traffic than adults.

At the start of each day and the end, a number of staff are on duty to welcome our students into school and wish them farewell at the end. This 'meeting and greeting' is also designed to oversee the safety of students on the road directly outside our school.

Since we have returned, I have observed a number of parents/carers dropping their child off for school directly outside the school gate on the yellow lines where there is a **no stopping and parking** area due to the close vicinity to our school gate.

Please can I ask that you adhere to these parking/ stopping regulations to help keep our school community safe.
