As you may be aware, school budgets are under increasing pressure due to rising costs but, despite these challenges, we are committed to providing your children with the highest quality education and enriching opportunities both inside and outside of the classroom. However, to continue doing so, we rely on the generous contributions of parents/carers to enhance what we can offer beyond the standard curriculum.

A suggested voluntary donation of £60 per family (you will find this on your **Scopay** account) can help us maintain and improve the experiences available to our students.

These funds are used for a range of important purposes, including:

- The maintenance and replacement of pupil lockers, ensuring students have a safe and secure space for their belongings.
- The running costs of our school minibus, allowing us to transport students to sporting events, field trips, and other enriching activities.
- The annual licence fee for running the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, which provides invaluable opportunities for personal growth and development.
- Supporting other school activities that enrich our pupils' experiences and open doors to learning beyond the traditional classroom setting.

We understand that families have different financial situations, and the £60 contribution is entirely voluntary. For your convenience, donations can be made either in one payment or spread out over regular instalments using our secure online payment system, Scopay.

Your generous support truly adds 'colour' to the opportunities we can offer, and we are deeply grateful for any contribution you are able to make. If you have any questions about how to donate or how the funds will be used, please do not hesitate to contact the school office.

Big shout out the Hanelle, who scored an impressive 100%!








Personalised Learning Award




